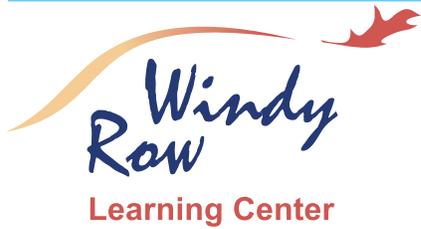
Windy Row's new One-in-Ten program will help educators recognize the earliest signs of dyslexia and other reading challenges.
