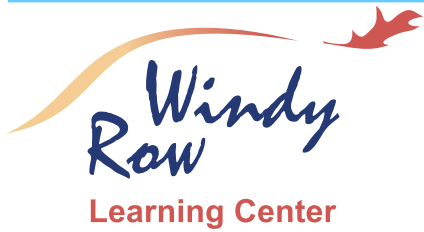
We don't stop for the summer at Windy Row! If your child needs help with reading and math, we can arrange for individual tutoring that fits around your vacation and summer schedule.

Tutoring sessions are normally 1 hour long,

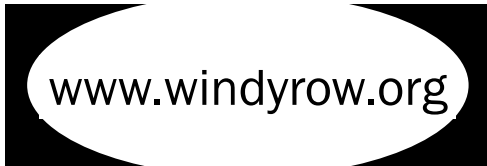
twice a week. They reinforce and build on your child's strengths.

Lizbeth (not her real name) struggled in kindergarten from the beginning, and her parents feared she might be kept back. Her mother brought her to Windy Row where we began developmentally appropriate activities to help her learn her letters and sounds and begin to read.

Lizbeth loves Windy Row! She gets to write letters in sand and shaving cream and cut out paper letters to decorate with her choice

of glitter or beads (she always chooses glitter).

That's part of the beauty of multisensory instruction: it involves the whole child and approaches reading from an unexpected and fun direction.

This bright kindergartner is now reading on nearly the same level as the other kindergarten children. Lizbeth will come to Windy Row for summer tutoring in reading and math; and next school year, when

she's in first grade, we will concentrate on math.
