meet your child's needs. One size *never* fits all!

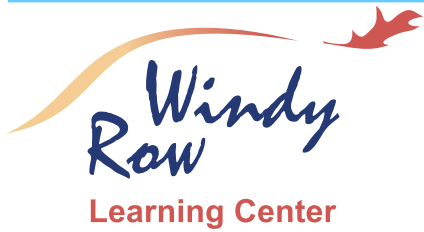
One-on-one: your child is assigned a personal tutor, the same tutor at every session.

is tutored for 1 hour, 2 days a week.

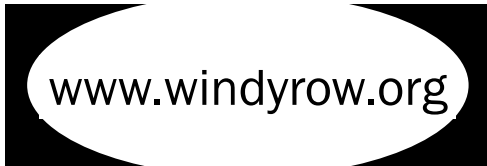

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## From Our Blog: What Children Need to Know



Children with reading and math challenges need to know that they approach reading and math in a different way—not a bad way—and that difference often has incredible benefits in creative thinking.

At Windy Row Learning Center, what we hear most often from children is that they feel "stupid" or "broken."

They may have been told that they are lazy and not working hard enough; that they are

underachievers; and that they are disruptive, which you would be, too, if you were trapped in a room all day long facing failure after failure.

Children need reassurance that dyslexia is not their fault or anybody's fault. Every individual's brain works differently; we all have strengths and weaknesses; and those with reading and math challenges can learn techniques to help themselves. Reading is a relatively new skill for

human beings and is only one skill among many.

No child has to suffer through 12 years of school unable to crack the reading or math code.
